PREVIOUS MEETING (7/06/16) by Ron Rayevich

Ben Bates, our 2016-17 President, began the meeting by showing his power point slides on the 2016 Rotary International Convention in Seoul, Korea where he had the opportunity to meet the incoming International President. Our speaker was Susan Nilon, who explained how since 1983 the 50 media companies have merged into just six and how that consolidation of the media industry impacts the news we receive. Susan is a media specialist and for five years had her own talk radio show on WSRQ. She described how media bias resulting from this consolidation into the big six companies (Viacom, CBS, Time-Warner, Disney, Comcast, and Newscorp) might be changing the way we understand the news. Rather than news anchors, who were respected in the past to give us the unbiased news stories, today we have political pundits, who present the news of the day from a particular political point of view. Even though the internet could provide a bias free source of news, nearly 10% of the US population do not access to high speed internet. Susan also discussed her road trip with President Obama in Florida and another example of news bias.
