In one of most thought provoking and stimulating presentations of the year, **Alex Beavers**, a veteran high-tech executive and entrepreneur, discussed the **Integration of Art and Design via Technology**.

Alex explained why products from Apple, Tesla, Bose, and Keurig are so appealing because they have been able to combine artistic design with functionality, and stimulate our desire for these attractive and useful products. We were able to follow the evolution of Computer Aided Design (CAD) from the mid-1970s to three dimensional design (CAD3) to Computed Aided Engineering (CAE) on to 3D Simulation, and finally to Computed Generated Imagery (CGI) and 3D Printing.

The combining of Art and Design with Technology have produced many of the innovations which we take for granted today. In the future we will see the advancement of Augmented Reality and Artificial Intelligence as the keys to innovation, new products, and job creation. According to Alex, colleges, such a Ringling College of Art and Design, will be on the forefront of these advances, using its strong art and design educational foundation to combine with technology to create unique opportunities in cinematic entertainment and gaming as well as product design.
