"I hear and I forget, I see and I remember, I do and I understand" - Confucius. Angela Hartvigen, Fine Arts Program Specialist for the Sarasota County School District and Manager of EdExploreSRQ, not only shared this quote with us, but gave a comprehensive power point presentation on how arts, music, theater, culture and science are incorporated into the K through 12 learning experience in Sarasota County Schools. EdExploreSRQ provides a web site (*thanks to a grant from the Patterson Foundation*) which allows teachers to access 55 different non-profit and for-profit organizations active in the arts, culture and science. In addition there are 11 teaching artists in the area who provide in-classroom programs appropriate for students in these same areas.

Some of these programs are offered in the students' classrooms and others are offered at various sites in the Sarasota metro area suitable for field trips. The programs receive additional support from the Community Foundation of Sarasota County (*which incidentally manages our club's foundation's endowment*), the Education Foundation of Sarasota County (*with which our club and its foundation has co-sponsored several school-oriented activities in the recent past*) and the Arts and Cultural Alliance, which helps coordinate our many community arts and culture organizations.

Overall, there are 250 separate "explorations" to which Sarasota County teachers have access via the web site in order to enrich students understanding and help tie together music with math, art with science, and theater with culture. Thanks, Angela, for helping to assure that Sarasota students benefit from the rich culture base for which Sarasota is famous.
