TODAY'S PROGRAM



Dr. Eric Haura, Director, Lung Comprehensive Research Center and interim chair, Department of Thoracic Oncology, will talk to us about lung cancer treatment and perhaps various genetically-targeted cancer therapies. He is director of a world renowned cancer research laboratory, He has a B.S.: Biomedical Engineering, The Johns Hopkins University; M.D.: Duke University School of Medicine; Residency: Internal Medicine, The Johns

Hopkins Hospital; Clinical Fellow: Hematology and Oncology, Duke University Medical Center; Research Fellow: Department of Genetics, Laboratory of Dr. Joseph Nevins, Duke University Medical Center, October 1998 to June 2000. Dr. Haura is an expert in the management of lung cancer. He has designed and executed numerous clinical trials exploring new agents for the treatment of lung cancer. He is interested in biomarkers to predict therapeutic responses in lung cancer and is active in developing molecular based therapeutic clinical trials. He has organized the department's genome medicine strategy to bring precision medicine to the bedside and is interested in migrating new platforms to the bedside to assist in clinical decision making.
