PREVIOUS MEETING (06/05/2019) BY RON RAYEVICH

Our **Club Assembly** featured three speakers, preceded by **Andy Lyman** from the Rotary Club of Sarasota Sunrise, who brought us a check for \$3,000 for the One Book Initiative. **Sarah Lodge**, President 2018-19 of our Foundation, brought us up to date on the major projects undertaken on behalf of the club this year, which included two \$26,000 grants for One Book Initiative and Kindergarten Readiness Bags respectively, plus grants or support of \$2,500 to \$6,000 for the Literacy Council of Sarasota, Embracing Our Differences, the Pioneer Picnic, and Alta Vista and Booker Food Pantries. **Andrea Nierenberg**, chair of our Membership Committee, noted that even with the loss of several members including deaths of five club members in 2018-19, our club membership currently stands at 106 members with the potential to growth to 115 and that attendance was 64%. Finally, **Lois Schaper**, chair of our International Committee, reminded us that our club teamed up with other clubs to provide funds frequently supported by global grants for projects in Kenya to avoid armed conflicts in that area, in India to provide for a retention basin near Mumbai, 34 flush toilets for a village in Bhutan, and a \$15,000 sanitation project in Guatemala, plus repairs to the 300 stoves our club purchased for that same village in Guatemala. Thanks **Sarah, Andrea and Lois** for your leadership and hard work in 2018-19, and for your success in making our club a better place for its members, and for the positive impact of the projects it undertakes in Sarasota and around the world.
